1. Local Governance Performance Management System (LGPMS)	LGPMS is a self-assessment tool utilized by the local government units to measure their performance in terms of administrative, social, economic, environmental and fundamentals of governance.	<u>77 LGUs</u> with State of Local Governance Report (SLGR) 4 Provinces 6 cities 67 municipalities
2. Monitoring Compliance to the Full Disclosure Policy (FDP)	Local Government Units are directed under Memorandum Circular No. 2010-083 to post in various modalities the fourteen (14) financial documents. This is part of the efforts of the department to ensure transparency and accountability among LGUs.	<u>77 LGUs</u> complied with the full disclosure policy 4 Provinces 6 cities 67 municipalities
3. Seal of Good Housekeeping (SGH)	Recognizing the primacy of performance, accountability, transparency and participation, the SGH is given to LGUs with good performance in internal housekeeping particularly in local legislation, development planning, resource generation, resource allocation and utilization, customer service, human resource management and development and valuing the fundamentals of governance.	
4. Performance Challenge Fund (PCF)	PCF is an incentive fund given to LGUs which are recipient of

PCF may be used to finance development projects of LGUs which geared towards achievement of MDGs and maintenance of core road network to boost tourism and local economic development, promotion of transparency and accountability in government transactions and compliance with RA 9003 (Ecological Solid Waste Management Act of 2000) and Philippine Disaster Risk Reduction Management Act of 2000 (RA10121).</p>	
<p>5. Barangay Newly Elected Officials (BNEO) Orientation Program</p>	<p>This orientation program for newly elected officials of the barangays intends to provide them with knowledge and skills on their roles and responsibilities.</p>	
<p>6. Newly Elected Officials (NEO) Orientation Program – Sharpening the Saw</p>	<p>The NEO program – Component 4: Sharpening the Saw intends to provide technical assistance to the local government officials through a demand-driven trainings which will specifically answer their capacity development needs.</p>

<p>1. Supporting Capacity of LGUs on DRRM/CCA</p>	<p>This program includes enhancing capacities of LGUs on DRRM/CCA through capacity development/building trainings , assessing resiliency of local infra to disaster as well as disaster readiness.</p>

Competitive and Business Friendly LGUs		
1. Streamlining Business Permit and Licensing System (BPLS)	<p>In partnership with the DTI, this project aims to streamline the business permits and licensing system (BPLS) of LGUs to attract investors that will lead to increased local revenues. LGUs are expected to follow the standards on BPLS streamlining, particularly on the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Adoption of the BPLS Unified Form - Reduction in the number of signatories (maximum of 5) - Limit in the number of steps in applying/processing business permits and licenses - Reduction in the processing time (new application: maximum of 10 days; renewal: maximum of 5 days) 	
2. Implementation of Anti-Red Tape Act	<p>The DILG monitors compliance of the LGUs on RA 9485, the Anti Tape Act of 2007. The law required LGUs to formulate citizen’s charter which will serve as guide of clients on the processes involved in availing particular services. It is the intention of the law to eliminate red tape in government transactions by improving its frontline services and streamlining its transactions/processes.</p>

<p>1. Strengthening Local Peace and Order Councils</p>	<p>Along with secretariat services to the Local Peace and Order Councils (LPOCs), DILG likewise provides technical assistance and monitors functionality of the council. The LPOCs are tasked among others to look into the peace and order and security of the locality.</p>	
<p>2. Lupon Tagapamayapa Awards and Incentives</p>	<p>Recognizing good practices and performance of barangay justice system, the Lupon Tagapamayapa Award is given to deserving Lupon Tagapamayapa which exemplified performance in promoting the KP objectives in handling, settling, resolving cases thus easing the court dockets.</p>
