# DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT REGION XIII (CARAGA) PHYSICAL REPORT OF OPERATIONS FOR THE YEAR ENDING 2015

# OUTCOME: ACCOUNTABLE, TRANSPARENT, PARTICIPATORY AND EFFECTIVE LOCAL GOVERNANCE

#### 1. FULL DISCLOSURE POLICY

# 7. Community-Based Monitoring System (CBMS)

Six (6) personnel both from the Regional Office and different Provincial Offices of DILG XIII were able to participate and completed the Central Office initiated Trainer's Training on CBMS Modules 3 & 4 held in Subic, Zambales during the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter of the current year. As expected these set of Trainers will take the lead and will conduct Roll-Out of the said Training with the LGUs who have proposed Capacity Building projects on CBMS in their FY 2016 Local Poverty Reduction Action Plan (LPRAP) and to those LGUs that may request the Department to provide capacity development relative to CBMS in the near future.

#### **OUTCOME: BUSINESS-FRIENDLY AND COMPETITIVE LGUS**

# 1. Accelerating Investments for More Business (AIMBIZ) in LGUs

- Facilitated the conduct of Seminar/Workshop on Business Planning/ Updating/Formulation of Local Revenue Code/LIIC

#### 2. STREAMLINING OF BPLS AND OTHER REGULATORY SERVICES

- 100% of cities and municipalities were monitored on its compliance to BPLS Reforms standards
- 73 or 93% (5 cities and 63 municipalities) of cities and municipalities have

fully complied to BPLS Reforms standards

- Conducted orientation workshop on RS4LG to 3 cities (Cabadbaran, Bayugan & Tandag) with the participation of their respective City Administrator, BPLO, Office of Building Official, City Engineering, City Planning, City Health & SP Chair on related program
- Conducted Focused Group Discussion to the same target cities as a follow

through on the conducted orientation on RS4LG. The said activity was aimed at discussing the elements in the current BPLS process, identifying the elements essential to the process, and enhancing existing LGU BPLS process.

#### 3. PRMF

- As per Memorandum of Subsidiary Agreement entered into by the DILG and the Department of Foreign Affairs Trade (DFAT), contract management for PRMF projects are now moved to provincial government thru a process called Novation. As of December 31, 2015, Deed of Novation and all other PRMF-related documents have been prepared and transmitted to PLGUs. Signing of Deed of Novation is still under process.

#### 4. SLRF

- 1 FY 2012 project implemented by the City of Cabadbaran is on-going as of the report period.
- 10 LGUs (4 provinces and 6 cities (Agusan del Norte, Agusan del Sur, Surigao del Sur and Province of Dinagat Islands and all of the 6 cities (Butuan, Bayugan, Cabadbaran, Bislig, Surigao and Tandag) qualified to received funding for FY 2015, Documents for SARO already processed and submitted to DILG RO and subsequently endorsed to DPWH RO.
- Awaiting release of SARO from DPWH as of end of December 2015
- All of the 5 provinces and 6 cities conducted their respective Local Road Management Performance Assessment (LRMPA).

# OUTCOME AREA: ENHANCING LGU CAPACITY ON DISASTER RISK REDUCTION/CLIMATE CHANGE

# 1. ENHANCING LGU CAPACITY ON DRR-CCA

Conducted Capacity Development on:

- Formulation of Local Climate Change Adaptation Plan to a total of 19 LGUs

eastern seaboard LGUs of the Region.

- Geographical Information System for the preparation of Risk Map to a total

of 18 eastern seaboard LGUs of the Region.

- Regional Strategic Planning Workshop on Mainstreaming Disaster Risk Reduction and Management – Climate Change Adaptation in Local Development Plans to a total of 40 participants from the different regional line agencies of the Region.
- Conducted advocacy and information campaign to a total of 22 participants coming from the Agusan River LGUs and Eastern seaboard LGUs on mainstreaming Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Climate Change Adaptation in Local Development Plan

- Conducted, under the BNEO program, training on Community-Based Disaster Risk Reduction and Management to a total of 107 participants coming from the municipalities of Cagdianao, San Jose & Loreto all in the Province of Dinagat Islands
- Conducted, in coordination with the Local Government Academy a tsunami drill in the Province of Dinagat Islands

#### **OUTCOME: SOCIALLY PROTECTIVE AND SAFE LGUS**

In consonance with the provisions of Administrative Order 46 and in order to comply with the directives of the Central Office top management, that is to have all locally funded projects for 2013-2014 completed by 80%, and at least 50% of all locally-funded projects for FY 2015 by end of September 2015, DILG Region XIII issued Regional Order No. 35 dated April 29, 2015 and installed its own Full Delivery Unit to ensure that provisions of the abovementioned directives are carried through. As such, the Region has geared all its efforts towards an intensified program/project implementation. Thus, for the year that has ended, the Region has achieved significant accomplishments on the PPAs under the outcome area on socially-protective and safe LGUs.

All in all, there are a total of 587 locally-funded (infra) projects which the Region has implemented and is implementing from Project Years 2012-2015. Of these total number of projects, 301 were already completed, 216 are still ongoing, 29 are under procurement, 34 are already approved and 7 are under preparation as of the report period. The total cost for all of these projects amounted to P2,391,320,815.75. While 100% of the total cost was already obligated as of the report period, only 2,127,876,351.88 or 88.987% was disbursed to the respective project beneficiaries so far. All these developments has resulted to a project Completion Rate of 51.28% and Accomplishment Rate of 72.63% for the Region. The following are the details of this project implementation:

# 1. SAGANA AT LIGTAS NA TUBIG (SALINTUBIG) PARA SA LAHAT

# FY 2013

- 4 or 100% of 4 projects implemented by 2 municipalities in AgusandelNorte were completed.
- 100% of the project cost of 2.5 million were already obligated and disbursed to the recipient LGUs.

# FY 2014

- 2 or 29% of the 7 subprojects for implementation for FY 2014 were completed.
- 4 or 57% on-going and 1 or 14% under procurement.

- 100% of total project cost of Php12,730 million were obligated and Php10,615 million or 83% of it were disbursed to all 6 recipient LGUs.

#### **FY 2015**

- 9 or 19% of the 48 subprojects were under procurement
- 7 or 15% under preparation and 32 or 67% were approved and are ready for procurement
- 100% of the total project cost of Php83,730 million were obligated with Php68,000,000 or 81% of it disbursed to the recipient LGUs.

#### 2. PAMANA Pillar 3

- 3 or 80% of the 5 remaining subprojects were completed.
- 1 or 20% is still on-going construction.
- 100% of the total cost of P480,950,000 were obligated with P438,410,494 or 91% of it were already disbursed to project recipient LGUs.

#### FY 2015

- 6 or 21% of the 28 subprojects were completed.
- 19 or 68% on-going construction, 2 or 7% under procurement process and 1 or 4% approved for procurement.
- 100% of the total cost of Php841,850 million were obligated with 82% or Php687,936.15 were disbursed to all project recipient LGUs.

# 3. BUB Water System Projects

#### FY 2013

- 1 or 25% was completed of 4 remaining subprojects were completed.
- 3 or 7% are on-going construction.

#### FY 2014

- 31 or 65% of the 48 remaining subprojects were completed.
- 17 or 35% were on-going construction.
- 100% of the total project cost of Php94,418,596.16 million were obligated with Php88,274,846 or 93% of it were disbursed to 28 recipient LGUs.

#### FY 2015

- 19 or 17% of the 114 subprojects were completed.
- 93 or 82% were on-going construction and 2 or 2% were under procurement process.
- 100% of the total project cost of Php167,121,033.40 were obligated with Php150,907,542.27 or 90% of it already disbursed to a total of 44 recipient LGUs.

# 4. BUB Local Access Road Project

- 9 or 60% of the 15 targeted FY 2014 remaining subprojects were completed.

- 6 or 40% were on-going construction.

# 5. BUB Other Local Infra Projects
